From Your Priest:



"The Prayer of the Pharisee" Luke 18:9-14

We get another little drama in Luke with just two characters. The Pharisee and the Tax Collector. In the setting of the day, this would be a stark contrast between the

socially prominent (the Pharisee) and the socially despised (the Tax Collector). A study in contacts: good versus bad, right versus wrong, that sort of thing. It's very clear cut on the surface. What is revealed in their prayer life, however, provides an equally stark contrast. The "righteous" one offers a prayer of self-praise, essentially thanking himself for being so worthy. The "evil" one comes to God in the deepest humility, begging for mercy—not leniency but unction, or anointing of healing balm. It is the tax collector, of all people, who teaches us how to pray: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." And it is the self-righteous one who forces us to think about all that we have in common with him.
