# From Your Priest:



"A Fleeting Triumph"

**Matthew 21:1-11** 

Jesus enters the capital as a very different kind of King. There is no gilded carriage, and

no military escort or trumpet fanfare. The Lord sends his disciples ahead to untie a donkey and a colt to bear him into the great Jerusalem. Jesus quotes the prophet Zechariah to describe the depth of humility that is captured in his

kingship. "Lowly," is what most of the translations say. Not lofty, not made for any lasting impression, but bereft of pretension.

Nevertheless, the reception of Jesus is rapturous. Crowds of people lay down their coats as a sign of welcome, and many waved branches of palms to amplify their enthusiasm. It must have been quite a moment. It had to have created thrilling expectations of success and triumph. The moment did not last. Expectations were defeated. Triumph turned to tragedy. The quick turn of events provides a vivid illustration of the capriciousness of human nature, and its brutality.
