


Readings for 3rd Sunday of Easter

April 26, 2020

Acts 2:14a, 36-41 Psalm 116:1-3, 10-17 1 Peter 1:17-23 Luke 24:13-35

From Your Priest:



"The Broken Bread"
Luke 24:13-35

Luke gives us the revelation of the Risen Lord in the breaking of the bread. The disciples are confused. They're tired, and stressed. In that moment, Jesus, who has been crucified and

raised from the dead, comes alongside. They fail to recognize him. Still, it is in the moment of sharing their meal

that Christ is revealed. This is at the heart of our Eucharistic celebration.

It has been a hard separation from the Eucharist in our current situation. We know that Christ is walking alongside us in ways we do not recognize. The disciples took from this experience a need to proclaim Christ and to reveal him to others. It is a very good lesson for us in our time and day.

THINK ON THIS:



When you have Christ you are rich and sufficient. He will be your provider and faithful watchman in everything, so that there is no need to hope in men.
