## "Before the World Existed" John 17:1-11

Jesus may be saying, "farewell" but it is not some temporary or superficial adieu. In fact, he is reminding us of his place in eternity, a glory that he shared with God the Father before the world existed. Jesus has

come into this mortal life in order to bring us into the eternal with him. Eternity is not some vague abstraction. It is life itself, and life that is lived out in the relationship that Jesus has with each of us, all of us. Jesus describes all this variously as "glory."

He also speaks to us about the divine relationship, shared by him and God the Father which is entirely grounded in love. We, too, are called to that sort of relationship in Christ even as we remain in this mortal life. Still, Christ calls for our protection. It is the sort of care and cover that the world cannot provide. Jesus lays claim to us, advocates for us, and seeks our protection.
